- A person attending a Hope Church Event who does not wish to have their child's image recorded for distribution should complete the Opt Out Form found on our website and email it to kids@sharethehope.org. You will receive an email confirmation that your form was received by Hope Church.
- By participating in Hope Church Events or by failing to notify Hope by emailing the Opt Out Form of your desire not to have your photograph or your child's photograph used by Hope, you are agreeing to release, defend, hold harmless and indemnify Hope from any and all claims involving the use of your picture or likeness.
- Any person or organization not affiliated with Hope may not use, copy, alter or modify Hope photographs, graphics, videography or other, similar reproductions or recordings without the advance written permission of an authorized designee from Hope.

Hope Church Behavior Policy

- Our goal is to ensure that every child experiences a loving Christian environment which includes feeling safe and cared for resulting from positive interaction with peers and adults.
- To help achieve this goal, all children will be expected to behave respectfully to all staff and to each other.
- Hope reserves the right to ask that a child be taken home for the remainder of the day in the following situations:
 - Repeated hitting/pushing
 - Repeated and/or unwanted touching/hugging of other children
 - Running away from adults (inside or outside); running in or out of classrooms
 - Any behavior which results in or causes potential injury to other children
 - Verbal comments or gestures of inappropriate language and/or behavior
- If a child's behavior becomes concerning to the teacher and does not improve with standard behavior tactics, the teacher will call the parent or guardian.
